
## **BOOK CLUB QUESTIONS**

- 4. Discuss the role of radio broadcasting in the story. How does Drue use this medium to fight against Nazi propaganda and influence American public opinion?
- 5. The novel explores themes of loyalty, resistance, and sacrifice. Which instances of these themes resonated with you most strongly?
- 6. The story is told from Drue's first-person perspective. How does this narrative choice affect your connection to the character and the events of the story?
- 7. Jane Healey blends historical fact with fiction in this novel. How well do you think she balances these elements? Did it enhance your enjoyment of the story?
- 8. If you were in Drue's position, would you have made similar choices? What would you have done differently?
- 9. How does Drue's journey from Hollywood actress to resistance fighter challenge or reinforce your perceptions of courage and heroism?
